MINISTER'S Report

For everyone will be salted by fire. Salt is good; but if salt has lost its saltiness, how can you restore its saltiness? Have salt in yourselves, and be at peace with one another. Mark 9:49-50

Dear Friends in Christ:

I love Jesus' use of salt to describe our life together as congregations of the Trinity-Anjou Pastoral Charge, and not just because (as you know) I'm a salt-junky!

Mark places this teaching just after a section in which time after time, Jesus' disciples just aren't getting what their rabbi and teacher is all about. First, they are arguing with each other over who is the greatest disciple of all. Then, they see God's work being done by a healer who isn't part of their group. The disciples want to tell this healer to cease and desist, but Jesus tells them, "look, if he isn't working against us, then he's working for us." Jesus wanted to expand their minds about who was "in" the work of ministry rather than look for reasons to exclude people. He wanted his disciples to tear down the barriers and obstacles that kept people away from him – and therefore, from them too.

Jesus wanted followers who would use everything they had and everything they were becoming in the service of God's dream for the world – a world of justice and peace.

Isn't it amazing that God wants us to be ourselves – to let our salt show – to each other and to the communities around us? God chooses to be revealed in Christ, and in the Christ-likeness we attempt in small and bigger ways on a daily basis. We do this as individuals, but we also are part of a community larger than ourselves. We do it with our friends in the Anglican, Catholic and Presbyterian denominations. We are never alone in trying to nudge the kingdom into being, the fruit of which, Jesus tells us, will be peace.

I write in this space every year just a fraction of the ways our churches serve others beyond our doors. This is where ministry gets real.

Only a fraction of ministry happens in church on a Sunday morning (as uplifting and en-spiriting as we try to make it!). Most of the salt we show others occurs around our kitchen tables on a weekday, or in our workplace, or the phone calling we do to friends, shut-ins, visiting people we know who are having a tough time and need our help, newcomers who need help integrating into the life of the community.

We also show our salt by being willing to persevere with people or problems or issues we believe in despite the cost to us. God calls us to be there, and we go.

2016 is now past, like old salt, and we look forward to what adventures the Spirit will invite us in 2017. May the fire of God's spirit find your heart in this coming year. May you claim your passion for ministry and share it, grow it, have fun with it, be transformed by it. That will make us one salty pastoral charge – mmm – no wonder I'm lovin' it!




