We've learned so much about ourselves and our world in the last few weeks since the COVID-19 pandemic was proclaimed by the World Health Organization. What started out as a localized "novel" virus in Wuhan, China has since gone around the world.

marking all of us in its wake as alobalization shows how interconnected we are - and. whether we like it or not - how interdependent we are. Now we know how

vulnerable we can be too - new viruses not knowing borders. We are all one, needing to "sink or swim" together as we pray for as much of the world as possible to stay safe.


Every **Tuesday** morning at **10:30 AM**. Gather with Gary Tompkins and other friends. Come chat, check in, and play games together.

Walk through Holy Week with Jesus

Here is an activity for kids of all ages as we walk through Holy Week with Jesus. You will find a picture of Jesus in your envelope. Go ahead — colour him and cut him out. He'll walk with you through all of your activities this week.

Each day there is a Bible reading, a reflection, and an activity. We invite you to post photos of your completed activities on our Facebook page so we can share in the journey together.

Prepare. In preparation of Holy Week (April 5 – April 12), we invite you to colour and cut out Flat Jesus.

Sunday: Jesus enters Jerusalem (Matt. 21: 1-11).

- **ACTIVITY 1**: Place Jesus among the plants of your home to signify the palm branches that people waved.
- **O ACTIVITY 2**: Use your stuffed animals or other friends to create a palm parade for Jesus.

Monday: Jesus cleanses the temple (Matt. 21-12-17)

- O **ACTIVITY 1**: Take some time today to reflect on a bad habit you can rid yourself of to become closer to God.
- **ACTIVITY 2**: Sort through your clothes, toys, or kitchen supplies. What can you give away to someone who needs it?

tuesday: Jesus washes his disciples feet (John 13: 1-17)

- **O ACTIVITY 1**: Take a picture of Jesus beside a body of water: a bathtub, the sink, a lake, etc.
- **ACTIVITY 2**: Be a secret agent for God: how many nice things can you do for people in your home without getting caught?



Wednesday: Jesus and his disciples share The Last Supper (Matt. 26:17-30)

- **O ACTIVITY 1**: Bring Jesus to dinner with you and re-enact Jesus sharing communion.
- O **ACTIVITY 2**: Our Jewish brothers and sisters are celebrating Passover tonight. Find out about this holiday and how it connects Judaism and Christianity.

thursday: Jesus prays (Luke 22:39-44)

- O **ACTIVITY 1**: Create a prayer space.
- O **ACTIVITY 2**: Call someone who may feel lonely and pray with them.

Friday: Jesus dies and is placed in a tomb (Matt. 26:45-61)

- **O ACTIVITY 1**: What needs to "die" in your life? Rekindle a relationship, say you're sorry. Learn to let go.
- O **ACTIVITY 2**: Build a person-sized fort to represent Jesus' tomb.

Saturday: The disciples wait in fear.

- **O ACTIVITY 1**: The unknown is scary. What are you afraid of today? Tell Jesus and ask him to help you overcome your fears.
- **ACTIVITY 2:** Make a prayer jar: mix oil, water, food colouring, and glitter in a sealable jar. When you're afraid, swirl it around and let the glitter carry your fears away.

Sunday: Jesus is alive! (Matt. 28:1-10)

- O **ACTIVITY 1**: Come worship with us on Zoom! Bring Jesus!
- O **ACTIVITY 2:** Find ways to keep your family traditions alive. Jesus lives why shouldn't your traditions?

A Letter to the Church from your Director of Finance, Philip Massarelli

Greetings from my office at home – bonjour de mon bureau "chez-moi".

Emails and phone calls have been our way of keeping in touch with our members, adherents and friends during this time of COVID-19 and the uncertainty of the world around us. My letter is designed to say "hello" – and that I am thinking about you and your extended families and friends.

The whole world is a moving target and who knows what exactly the world will look like when

you finally receive this message – will I have it right? Well if something looks odd – it may be that things have just changed again.

As soon as COVID-19 made its debut in Canada, the church Council met and discussed what to do. Keeping everyone safe was our priority. As school boards closed, we quickly followed their lead and decided that coming to church was not a safe option for most of our congregants, so we opted to close the building until further notice.

Immediately we came to the conclusion that we need to stay in contact with each other via mail, telephone and new online experiences. Staying together as a community would be our strength. As I think you can agree, we have done that.

When we met online as a church Council the other night, we talked about how the current COVID-19 emergency and the public health restrictions will affect our collective lives including our finances – your finances – my finances – our church's finances. How are we going to survive? Our church buildings are closed – many folks are off work – unable to get out – what to do?

My task was to draft this letter and to share my story and at the same time ask for your ideas on how we can continue our ongoing mission without our regular Sunday morning

gifts from you.

So, part of my story so far...

My life here at Trinity has had many great experiences over the years – to name a few:

- My family started coming to Trinity in 1963
- singing in the Junior Choir and joining the Scouts back in the 1960's
- playing badminton and being a member of the "Tower Youth Group" in the 1970's

- having our children, and then having them baptized in 1989 and 1992
- being an Elder, Trustee, Chair of the congregation, and currently the Director of Finance


