Minister's Message

Rev. Read is off again???

Do you find yourself asking or hear others ask the question "Read is off again this week! Just how much time does he take off?" Yes, he does get a fair amount of time off, but it is due to several mitigating factors. First, he has a lot of experience as a minister and is eligible for the maximum vacation time of four weeks due any minister with that much seniority. He also has three weeks of paid study leave, used for courses or to prepare for holiday worships. Lastly, when Read was hired, we negotiated four weeks of unpaid leave a year. A win for Trinity as we save some salary expense and a win for Read as he gets some extra time off for some special R&R. That is a total of eleven weeks throughout the year.

2020-2021 added some special nuances to the mix. With the Covid lockdown, Read did not take as much time off during the winter months as he could not go anywhere, leaving a larger than usual number of weeks due to him as the pastoral year came to a close. That is M&P's fault for not pushing him to take more time, as we thought life would open back up and it would all get sorted out. So some of his remaining 2020-2021 time was taken this summer, technically during the 2021-2022 pastoral year. All will be back to usual ( I won't say normal ) this September.
