

In December we raised \$900 for the Best Gift Fund (thanks to many generous donations!), had a Dough Holy Night cookie afternoon, read the candle lightings every Sunday during Advent, and led the whole worship service on the third Sunday of Advent!

This year there were several projects completed:

- Urgent repairs to the concrete in the front of the church were done after it was found that the cracks in it were causing water ingression into the building foundation and into the den.
- A mural was painted by a local artist on the wall in the laneway behind the church.
- Lights over the choir and the side light at the 8th Ave exit were repaired.
- Repairs were also done to the fire alarm system and to the furnace
- The new countertop and sink were installed into the kitchen

Ongoing work includes upkeep of the grass, repairs to leaky faucets and other regular maintenance around the church.

- Projects that are being proposed for the coming year include:
- Repairing the kitchen cupboards and repainting them
- Painting the fire escape this summer
- Planting new rose bushes and or other plants to rebuild the Michael Monaco Garden
- Putting down soil and new grass or clover ground cover in the church yard
- Getting new or gently used tables and chairs to replace the broken ones in the gym

To keep down the cost of fixing up the kitchen, we would like to have some volunteers come out to help. Improvements to the kitchen will not only make it nicer for our congregation to use, but also give us better rental potential. We estimate that this project would take 3-4 days and that volunteers can come for 1 or more days. We can work out the schedule to do the work once we know the availability of the volunteers.

We are looking for a couple of volunteers with green thumbs to spend a couple hours helping replant the Michael Monaco Garden this spring.

Thank you to Ashley for all his work around the church to keep things working and to Christine and to John Brosseau and John Bridgman for their contributions. All their work is vital to keeping our church going.

Regional Council Rep: Ivylin Scott

After many years of service as the regional council executive minister, Reverend Rosemary Lambie retired October 31st 2022. Also retired, Beverly Anderson-Levine (Archivist). A celebration was held in person and on Zoom to honour their service. They will be surely missed.

Reverend Éric Hébert-Daly was appointed to replace her starting January 2023. He has served in the french ministries since 2018 and was ordained in 2020.

At the November meeting, Fred Braman spoke about Bill 96 and the changes it could bring to the province. There was also concern about people with disabilities in the United Churches. It is very important that the churches are accessible and functional for everyone.

LLW: Licensed Lay worship leader.

After due research and consultation with legal counsel of the UCC, the Office of Vocation regarding policy for ordered ministers as well as Corrections Canada, a series of guidelines were recommended to the Executive, approved there and presented for information at the recent Regional Council meeting. These recommended changes set out a process for licensing of an individual who has turned they life around and would now be a valuable member of our LLWL's, regardless of whether or not they were able to obtain a pardon. (Note: to enter ordered ministry a person must qualify for and receive a pardon.)

Annual Congregational Meeting Minutes

March 20, 2022

An official Congregational Meeting was called several weeks prior to March 20th, 2022. One hundred and fourteen people were notified of the Annual Congregational Meeting by email and 17 people by post/ hand delivery. Also, an announcement for the meeting was made in church. The stated meeting was offered both in-person located in Trinity United Church's hall and it was accessible online via Zoom.

Call to order, opening statement, prayer

Rosemary Warren (Chair) declared this to be a duly constituted Congregational Meeting via Zoom and in person at 1:08 p.m.. Rev. Read Sherman led us in prayer.

Land Acknowledgment

Rosemary Warren acknowledged we are on Indigenous land.

Permission to record

Rosemary Warren requested permission to record the meeting for the purposes of minute taking. **Agreed.**

Rules of order

Rosemary Warren mentioned that this would be a hybrid meeting of people attending both inperson and online via Zoom. Rosemary Warren established the rules surrounding etiquette and voting for those in-person and those online.

Memorials

Rev. Read Sherman read the names of those who passed away this past year. Julia Budd lit candles in their memory. Rev. Read Sherman prayed.

Establishing Quorum

Gary Tompkins established quorum with more than 30 full members in attendance.

How to Vote

Rosemary Warren explained how to vote in-person as well as online via Zoom.

Enabling motion -- to allow adherents to vote

Sabz Heffernan moved and Gary Tompkins seconded to allow adherents to vote **Carried.**

Approval of the Agenda

John Bridgman moved and Jenn Carroll seconded the approval of the agenda.

Adoption of the 2021 Handbook Amendment Meeting minutes (December 5)

Veronica Heffernan (secretary) moved and Gary Tompkins seconded the adoption of the Minutes from the December 5th, 2021 meeting.

Carried.

Reports of officers, boards, and standing committees (Ministries)

a) Trinity Council

Sabz Heffernan thanked Rosemary Warren for organizing this meeting and they highlighted having a Confirmation class. Sabz Heffernan mentioned Trinity's work with Église Sainte-Claire.

b) Ministries

- Building and Grounds

Norman Doré mentioned the fire detection system that was installed in the church. Norman Doré thanked Ashley Verhaeghe for his work around the church.

- Christian Development

Jenn Carroll mentioned having difficulty with which direction to take when it comes to the needs of the congregation by incorporating online and in person interactions.

Jenn Carroll mentioned the Book Study group and that there is a Confirmation Class.

- Congregational Life

David Garland mentioned how things were put on hold due to Covid-19.

- Fund Development

Diane Best mentioned that it was difficult to raise funds because of the pandemic.

- Media

Mikayla-Aimee reported that the tech team has come a long way to now being a media ministry. They have worked hard to adapt the technologies. There are still audio issues. In the next little while, the booth will be installed in the church. This year, improvements to the audio, visuals and screen are priorities since the choir will hopefully be back.

Membership and Pastoral Care

Christine Tatarewicz enjoyed reaching out to the members of the congregation. Christine Tatarewicz thanked the volunteers who helped with outreach.

Mission and Outreach

No comments were made.

c) Église Sainte-Claire

Stéphane Vermette reported on Église Sainte-Claire. Stéphane Vermette mentioned that they are experimenting with different social media to reach many people. He mentioned that they are looking for advice concerning social media and how it fits within the United Church structure. Stéphane Vermette thanked Philip Massarelli and all of us at Trinity for our continued support.

d) Trustees

Rev. Read Sherman explained that the Trustees are responsible for the investment funds of the church and the buildings. Rev. Read Sherman mentioned that they should meet soon.

Approval of the 2021 Annual Report

Claudette Petrauskas moved and Kim Wildenmann seconded that the 2021 Annual Report be accepted.

Carried.

Carol Cunningham asked to see in the reports a balance between the numbers and people as this is a community.

Sheri Cameron commented that it was difficult to get the reports from people.

Highlights from Regional Council meeting, March 2022

Rev. Read Sherman mentioned that they have met three times. Rev. Read Sherman reported on the Regional Council meeting held in March 2022.

Reports of special committees for 2021

a) COVID-19 Task Force / Reopening Committee Sheri Cameron spoke about the evolution of parameters surrounding Covid-19. Sheri Cameron thanked Christine Tatarewicz for greeting people and checking people in as they entered the building.

b) Student Ministry Award

Rev. Read Sherman mentioned that Aaron Miechkota graduated with her Masters of Divinity degree from the United Theological College and moved to Ontario for her two-year appointment. Rev. Read Sherman said that the Council decided to create an award

for those who have graduated from UTC. Aaron Miechkota received gas cards and \$1,000 as gifts.

Unfinished Business

a) Correspondence

Sheri Cameron said there was no correspondence.

b) Mission & Service Totals

Rev. Read Sherman reported that \$5,440 was given to the Mission and Service fund.

c) Others

Rev. Read Sherman gave a shout-out to Sheri Cameron for the successful Vacation Bible Schools (VBS) camps and for keeping in touch with children who are a part of the greater community.

During a short break, Charles Dougherty mentioned he is a Yoga instructor, and he led the congregation in a chair Yoga exercise.

New Business

a) Financials Report

Philip Massarelli sent a consolidated report to the Congregation. Philip Massarelli thanked Beverly Bridgman, Shirley Cartmill, and Warren Purcell for their aide in collecting and documenting donations from the Congregation. Philip Massarelli said that Trinity closed its Laurentian Bank Account and moved the funds to the Ukrainian Desjardins branch and is using ADP. Philip Massarelli said that Trinity is using less cheques and is moving to online payments and direct deposits. Docusign is being used when it comes to retrieving the two signatures required for payments.

Charles Dougherty asked why there is a deficit. Philip Massarelli said that there have been at least 30 years of deficits. Philip Massarelli mentioned that we are still running as

a church because of the donations made by those who have passed away, the amalgamation with Saint George's and the sale of their building.

Julia Budd mentioned that there are some restrictions on some of the funds. Philip Massarelli mentioned that some of those funds were invested and the interest on those funds were being used.

Carol Cunningham asked where the endowments were coming from. Philip Massarelli mentioned that Judy Massarelli and Gail Purcell had made donations upon their passing.

Julia Budd mentioned that Trinity United and Anjou United have a partnership. Philip Massarelli said that we are a Trinity-Anjou Pastoral Charge and that Rev. Read Sherman's salary and some other expenses are divided between Trinity and Anjou at 75% and 25% respectively.

Rev. Read Sherman thanked the financial team for all their hard work.

b) Approval of the 2022 Budget

Philip Massarelli explained the consolidated budget and comparisons between 2019, 2020, 2021 actuals and the proposed budget for 2022.

Julia Budd mentioned that Trinity has been close to closing for a long time, but Trinity has always maintained that the people and community come first.

Beverly Bridgman said that in every other year for the Mission and Service budget, there were fundraisers. However, they put the budget for this year lower rather than higher so that it looks better when it is exceeded.

Giceline Beaudet and Eric Garçeau mentioned that if we could add more to our donations, we could help reduce the deficit.

Shirley Cartmill asked that if someone bought something for the church, would they need

approval, or can they buy the item and be reimbursed. Philip Massarelli said that's why

we have a budget and that each group should be getting together and identifying what

they need for the year.

Julia Budd asked that if we do not own the building, what would happen with the funds

from the sale of the building. Philip Massarelli said that since we are a part of a Regional

Council, we would need the approval from Regional Council and it would be up for

negotiations for the distribution of funds and assets.

Philip Massarelli moved and Giceline Beaudet seconded the approval of the 2022

Budget.

Carried.
