
your summer has been filled with natural beauty, family, adventures of many kinds! As fall comes, we look forward to seeing you once again as we continue to "share and grow in God's love."

## Taizé Prayer coming to Trinity-Anjou!

Starting on Thursday, Oct 3, 7:30pm in the Sanctuary, Rev. Read, Julia and interested choir members will be offering a monthly quiet service of prayer at Trinity that is open to all.

Taizé prayer is praying through singing simple melodies and beautiful words that open the heart to God's presence and grace. The songs are easy to learn – we already use some of them! – as we repeat them each a number of times through. That way, you quickly can pick up the melody, and let the words go deep into your hearts. The service will include singing, a short reading or readings, and silence, and should last no more than 45 minutes. We'll create a beauti-

ful candle-lit worship centre around which to gather, pray, and be at peace. For more information, please see Rev. Read.

We plan to Zoom the service for those who wish to participate (pray/sing!) at home. (On the first Thursday of each month, the Living Room will be preempted for Taizé prayer and/or other occasional special services.) We hope our Living Room gang (everyone is invited to Zoom for fun and fellowship on Thursdays at 7:30pm!) and church will wish to join us!

## Trinity Memorial Book and the Book of Celebrations

At Trinity, we have two books that we use to remember and celebrate people, occasions, and dates worth remembering. They are the Memorial Book and the Book of Celebrations.

The Memorial Book is a collection of several binders of pages remembering members, adherents and family members of Trinity United Church. The book was started in September 1979. The first entries list the parishioners who donated money to support purchasing the piano. (Rev. Dorothy Cunningham was the minister at that time, Shirley


Dazé was the Organist and Choir Director, and Shirley's husband, Réjean was our in-house, blind, piano tuner.) Arthur Schofield started the Memorial Book and did all of the calligraphy by hand.

Arthur continued to maintain all of the entries in the Memorial Book until the end of 1994. His beautiful work is missed. All entries from 1995 to the present have been done on a computer and are more stark, and not as warm as calligraphy by hand can be.

Whenever someone donates money to the church "in memoriam," and indicates that on the envelope, the envelope secretary informs the Communications team (Rosemary Warren) and the Memorial Book is updated.

The Book of Celebrations (a single binder) was started by Frank Massarelli. Carol Cunningham was the original designer and maintained it for a few years. Carol created the cover design, and it has always been maintained on a computer. The Book of Celebrations was started to encourage people to make donations to the church for happy events, not just when someone has died. Donations have been made to the church celebrating births, weddings, anniversaries and church groups and events. There are a few memorials as well.

Both the Memorial Book and the Book of Celebrations commemorate the people and events, as well as the joys and sadnesses, of our congregation. I would encourage you to make a donation to celebrate something important or trivial, adding to the history of our church and its congregants.
